History of March 24

- ◆ 1855 : For the first time long distance message was sent by telegraph between Kolkata and Agra.
- ♦ 1837 : Black citizens were given the right to vote in Canada.
- ♦ 1882: The deadly infectious disease TB was identified, the scientist who discovered it was later awarded the Nobel Prize.
- 1959: Iraq separated itself from the Baghdad Pact.

Current Affairs Related to 24 March

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina will inaugurate the India-Bangladesh Friendship Pipeline through video conference. This is the first such pipeline through which refined diesel from India will be supplied to Bangladesh. The project has been built under the grant-in-aid of the Government of India. The project involves the construction of a 130 km long pipeline that will connect Siliguri in West Bengal and Parbatipur in Dinajpur district of Bangladesh. The capacity of this pipeline is 1 million metric tonnes per annum.
- INS Dronacharya, the top urban school of the Indian Navy, will be awarded the President's Color for its distinguished services. The award will be given by President Draupadi Murmu, who serves as the Supreme Military Ruler, for exceptional service to the nation. The award is the highest accolade conferred by the President on an entity for exceptional service to the nation. Its main objective is to equip them with the day competencies required to deliver the ordnance to the specified target.
- The Global Millets Conference was inaugurated by PM Modi in New Delhi. A postage stamp and currency coin on International Millets Year 2023 was also unveiled by PM Modi. Agriculture ministers of six countries were involved in the conference. International scientists, nutritionists, health experts, start-up leaders and other stakeholders also participated in the conference. The conference attracted participants from over 100 countries and several stakeholders from across the globe. To promote millets, an exhibition cum buyer seller meet focused on millets was also organized.
- ♦ Bihar has the lowest literacy rate, followed by Arunachal Pradesh and Rajasthan, according to data shared by the Ministry of Education. Kerala has the highest literacy rate in India at 94%, followed by Lakshadweep at 91.85% and Mizoram at 91.33%.

- The Indian central government has launched a new edition of the MSME Competition program to encourage micro small and medium enterprises to adopt specialized manufacturing practices. Through this program Indian MSMEs will be helped to boost their quality, productivity and performance.
- ◆ The National Company Law Court approved the merger of HDFC Limited and HDFC Bank, which is considered to be the biggest merger in the history of Corporate India. The merger will create a mega banking entity combining India's largest housing finance company with the country's largest private bank.
 - IT major TCS CEO Rajesh Gopinath has tendered his resignation, and the company appointed K Krithivasan, its global head of the BFSI division, as CEO-designate with immediate effect. The board has designated Krithivasan as the CEO effective. Krithivasan will be appointed as the Managing Director and CEO in the next financial year. Gopinathan will remain with the company till September 15, 2023 to assist his successor.
 - Saraswati Samman 2022 was awarded to Tamil writer Sivashankari for his book Suryavansham. It is a book of memoirs in Tamil language and was published in 2019. Shivshankari's literary career spanned more than five decades. She is the author of 36 novels, 48 novels, 150 short stories, 15 travelogues, seven collections of essays and three biographies including one on former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.
 - The KK Birla Foundation has announced that Tamil writer Sivashankari will be the recipient of the prestigious Saraswati Samman Award 2022, for her 2019 autobiography, Surya Vansham. The award is one of the most honorable recognitions in Indian literature and carries Rs 15 lakh, a plaque and a memento.
