History of March 25

- ♦ 1898 : Swami Vivekananda initiated Sister Nivedita into celibacy.

Current Affairs Related to 25 March

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that PM MITRA Mega Textile Parks will be set up in seven states. PM Mitra Mega Textile Parks will be set up in Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Gujarat, MP and UP. PM Mitra Mega Textile Park will attract investment and create lakhs of jobs. These parks will provide infrastructure for the textile sector. PM Mitra Mega Textile Park will be a great example of Make in India and Make for the world. PM Mitra Park will help in achieving United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 9. It will develop integrated large scale and modern industrial infrastructure for the entire value chain of the textile industry.
- ♦ The book Snakes in the Ganges: Breaking India 2.0 written by Mr. Rajeev Malhotra and Madam Vijaya Viswanathan is gaining a lot of recognition in India. The book highlights various threats to India's national security from the United States, which are not known as major threats by the common Indian. While many see the major threats to Indian national security as coming from Pakistan, China, terrorism, illegal immigration from Bangladesh, leftist hegemony and Islamic extremism, the book also sees the US as a significant threat to India's security.
- Rao Inderjit Singh, Minister of State for the Ministry of Statistics and Program Estimates launched the 24th edition of Women and Men in India 2022 in New Delhi. The publication provides detailed information on a variety of topics such as political participation, employment and health, while it also provides gender disaggregated data that can help us understand how different groups of men and women live in different regions of India. What is the difference between
- Women and Men in India 2022 was launched by Minister of State Rao Inderjit Singh.

- The Financial Services Institutions Bureau has suggested that Ashwini Kumar, executive director of Indian Bank, be appointed as the managing director of UCO Bank. Kumar has previously held positions in several other public sector banks such as Bank of Baroda, Corporation Bank, Oriental Bank of Commerce and Punjab National Bank. FSIB interviewed 11 candidates from various PSBs for the post of MD & CEO. The final decision on appointment will be taken by the Appointments Committee appointed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- The government set up a centralized facility for voluntary closure of companies. The government has set up a Center for Processing Accelerated Corporate Exits at the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs in Haryana. It has been established under section 396 of the Companies Act. The new centralized facility will make decisions on corporate requests for closure. Now companies will not need to go to the Registrar of Companies in the state. The faceless approach will reduce human discretion and any subjectivity in the process.
- India's KR Parvathi has been appointed as the Resident Coordinator of the United Nations in Tajikistan. India's Kavilamadam Ramaswamu Parvathy has served in key roles in WFP in Turkey and Afghanistan. UN Secretary-General António Guterres has been appointed as the UN Resident Coordinator in Tajikistan.
- The Falcon LLM has been developed by the Technology Innovation Institute Abu Dhabi, UAE. Falcon is a large language model with 40 billion parameters and trained on 1 trillion tokens. It has been created by the AI Cross Center Unit of the AI and Digital Science Research Center.
- Researchers have discovered a new species of gecko in Gujarat. This new species is a Palearctic nuggettoed gecko of the genus Certopodion.
