# **History of March 29**

- 1561: Akbar attacked Sarangpur, the capital of Malwa and defeated Bajbahudar.
- ♦ 1943 : Freedom fighter and leader Laxman Nayak was hanged in Berhampur jail.
- ♦ 1954: The Indian Institute of Public Administration was inaugurated.
- 1857: Sepoy Mangal Pandey became known as a freedom fighter in the Bengal Native Infantry Rebellions against British rule in India and the long-running Sepoy War of Independence.

# **Current Affairs Related to 29 March**

- The Finance Minister has proposed to set up a committee to look into the issue of pension. According to the proposal, a committee will be constituted under the Finance Secretary. The committee will also evolve an approach that meets the needs of the employees while maintaining fiscal prudence. A committee will be set up to reform the new pension system to address the concerns of employees and maintain fiscal prudence. Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Punjab and Himachal Pradesh have reverted to the old pension scheme.
- An MoU has been signed between the Indian Army and the National Thermal Power Corporation Renewable Energy Limited. The project will be set up along the northern borders as well as in forward areas that are not connected to the national and state grids. Indian Army is providing land on lease for 25 years. It is committed to purchase the generated power through a power purchase agreement. NTPC will set up the proposed project on Build, Own and Operate model at a jointly identified location in Eastern Ladakh.
- The government has amended the export policy for bio fuel. It has allowed export of biofuels from Special Economic Zones and Export Oriented Units for fuel and non-fuel purposes without any restrictions. This is applicable only when the biofuel is produced using imported feed stock. Restrictions on the export of biofuels were imposed by the government on 28 August 2018.
- ♦ Uttar Pradesh Quality Resolution launched in Lucknow. It has been launched by the Government of Uttar Pradesh and the Quality Council of India in collaboration with industry associations. The industry associations are Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry of India Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry, Institute of Actuaries of India and PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry. UP's Deputy CM Shri Brajesh Pathak inaugurated the resolution.

- The Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways launched the Green Tug Transition Program. Under this programme, all tugboats running on nonfossil fuels like methanol, ammonia and hydrogen will be converted into green hybrid tugs. The Green Hybrid Tugs will be powered by the Green Hybrid Propulsion System. About 50% of all tugs will be converted to green tugs by 2030. This will help in reducing carbon emissions.
- DigiClaim has been launched for claim delivery through National Crop Insurance Portal. It has been launched under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana. Claims will now be delivered electronically. This will benefit the farmers of six states. This includes farmers from Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand and Haryana. The claims under this module will be paid directly to the farmers in their respective bank accounts in a transparent and accountable manner.
- Air Force Technical College and IISc Bangalore have signed MoU. The MoU will promote academic cooperation and research in defense related areas. It will enhance the scientific understanding of the adopted defense technologies. The MoU was signed by Air Commodore Ratnesh Gupta of the Technical College and Captain Shridhar Warrier of the Indian Institute of Science. The partnership will also allow college trainee officers to access IISc libraries.
- ♦ A rare bronze idol of Chola-era Hanuman has been brought to India after a long struggle by the Idol Wing CID of the Tamil Nadu Police. In 2012, the Hanuman idol was stolen from the Varadarajaperumal temple in Ariyalur district. Unknown persons had looted the bronze idols of Varadharaja Perumal, Sridevi, Bhudevi and Hanuman.
- Rae Bareli's hockey stadium is named after Rani Rampal, the star hockey player of the Indian team. She has become the first female player from India to achieve this feat. MCF Rae Bareli has renamed the Hockey Stadium as Queen's Girls Hockey Turf.
