- ◆ **1774** : The first office of postal service opened in India.
- ◆ **1867** : Prarthana Samaj was established in Mumbai.
- ◆ **2011** : According to the 2011 census data, the population of India increased to 121 crores.

Current Affairs Related to 31 March

- ◆ Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister and Union Minister Ghulam Nabi Azad has penned an honest and candid autobiography, which will be launched on April 5 in New Delhi. Titled Azad, it traces the political journey of Azad and provides an insight into the significant political changes that have taken place in India over the course of five decades. Azad, published by Rupa Publications India, is a factual reportage that gives an candid account of Azad's life and career, including the conversations he has with influential leaders in India and around the world.
- ◆ Shrimant Koket, a renowned Marathi writer and historian has released his first English book Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, translated by Dilip Chavan. The book was released by popular MP and actor Amol Kolhe, known for playing Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj and Sambhaji Maharaj in Marathi TV series.
- ◆ National women's hockey team midfielder Salima Tete has been appointed as the AHF Athletes Ambassador from India for a period of two years. Tete accepted the certificate and rank during the Asian Hockey Federation Congress in Mungyeong, Korea. Tete who led the Indian women's junior hockey team to a fourth-place finish at the 2021 FIH Women's Junior World Cup in Potchefstroom, South Africa.
- ◆ The report presented by UNESCO at the United Nations 2023 Water Conference in New York shows that a significant part of the world still lacks access to safe drinking water and adequate sanitation. The report noted that 26% of the global population lack access to safe drinking water, while 46% do not have access to well-managed sanitation facilities. Additionally, the report highlights that two to three billion people face water scarcity for at least one month every year, which can lead to serious consequences for livelihoods, especially for food security and electricity availability. in relation.
- ◆ First Citizens Bank & Trust Company will purchase all of Silicon Valley Bank's deposits and loans from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. The FDIC and First Citizens Bank have signed a purchase and assumption agreement. The 17 former branches of Silicon Valley Bridge Bank will open as First Citizens Bank & Trust Company.
- ◆ Taking a big decision in the cabinet meeting, the central government has made a big increase in dearness allowance. DA has been increased by 4 percent. The central government has increased the dearness allowance by 4 percent to 42 percent. Union Minister Anurag Thakur gave this information. Union Minister Anurag Thakur said that the government After the increase, the dearness allowance of central employees will increase from 38 percent to 42 percent.
- ◆ Lewis Caffarelli has been awarded the 2023 Abel Prize. He has been given this award for his contribution in mathematics to nonlinear partial equations and free boundary problems. This most prestigious award in mathematics is considered equivalent to the Nobel Prize. For the first time this award was given to Jean Pierre in 2003 for modernizing many parts of mathematics.
- ◆ Kerala Jyoti writer MT Vasudevan Nair was awarded the highest civilian award in Kerala. The second highest award, Kerala Prabha, is shared by actor Mammooty, former civil service officer T Madhava Menon and writer Omcheri NN Pillai.
- ◆ Anurag Behar, CEO of Azim Premji Foundation and Founder Vice President of Azim Premji University has written a new travel book. Titled A Matter of the Heart: Education in India, the book is a collection of 110 stories. Which is based on Behr's experiences working at the Foundation and sheds light on the state of education in India beyond the big cities. Behar dedicates his writings to the teachers who are shaping the future of the country.

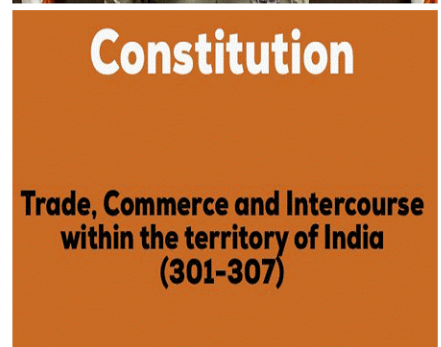
